

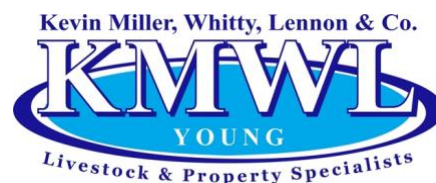

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

**The pavilion will be open on Friday 30 September 2022 at 8.30am for receipt of entries**  
**Pavilion entry nominations will NOT be accepted after 10am on Friday 30 September 2022**  
**All pavilion exhibits must be at the Showground no later than 11am on Friday 30 September 2022**  
**The show will be open to the general public from 9am on Saturday 1 October 2022**

**Membership Fees:** Family \$15, Single \$10, Lifetime \$150. Privileges of membership: (a) free admission to all sections of the Annual Show, unless otherwise stated. In the case of family membership, admission on the day of the Show for two adults plus children in family aged 16 years and under. (b) Right to nominate for office within the Association. (c) Power to vote at all meetings and to elect committee. (d) Free Admission to ground for member's vehicles provided that such vehicle is parked where the committee may direct.

**Show Day Admission:** \$5 per adult, \$0 concessions, \$2 per child aged 8-16 years, \$0 per child aged 8 and under. Family \$10 (2 Adults plus children aged 16 and under). This is a special reduced admission for the 2022 show.

**Exhibitors:** Entry fees are shown with headings at each section in schedule.

Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damages that may be done by any exhibit and the association reserves the right to refuse or admit any exhibit onto the ground where there is reason to suspect if either diseased or dangerous, or removing such exhibit from the ground.

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or their principle at the time of entry. All co-joint owners must be the property of a recognised firm or partnership (certificate of registration may be requested) and all exhibits when admitted to the showground will be under the control of the committee.

No exhibit will be removed from the ground before Saturday 4.00 pm without the permission of the stewards.

Parties in charge of exhibits must report their arrival on the ground immediately to the stewards. All names and other marks on exhibits indicating ownership must be removed to the satisfaction of the stewards but may be replaced after the judging.

Exhibitors will render themselves liable to a penalty of up to \$50 by removing any official placard, ticket or ribbon affixed or posted by the stewards, or affixing another ticket, placard or ribbon in lieu thereof, or by refusing in any way to carry out instructions of stewards, who shall incur no responsibility by putting these regulations into force.

The ages of exhibits of livestock, also breeders' name (where these are known) must be furnished by the exhibitor at time of entry. If desired by the committee, the exhibitor must make a statutory declaration that their exhibit conforms to the conditions under which the prizes they compete for are offered.

Exhibits which cannot be shown in any competing section may be offered as non-competitive exhibits.

The Association may withhold any prize when statements have erroneously and fraudulently been made regarding exhibits.

Should any exhibit have gained a prize be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The committee with or without the judge can decide the question.

Any protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within half an hour of the event in question with a sum of \$50 attached. This sum may be forfeited if the protest is found to be frivolous or unproven.

Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize.

The committee reserves the right to reduce the prize money or cancel any event of competition's not forthcoming in any of the classes in this schedule. Where trophies are listed, there must be two or more exhibitors before trophy is competitive.

The committee will not be held responsible for injuries, loss or damage to exhibits, exhibitors or personnel.

Judges may award a second prize in lieu of first or may withhold altogether any prize money when there is only one exhibitor or when the exhibits are considered not worthy.

All persons who, after entering their exhibits (stock in particular) are unable to exhibit, should notify the Secretary at least three days before the Show to assist the stewards to make other arrangements.

Prize money must be collected on the day or at the latest within one month or it shall be forfeited.

**Waiver forms must be signed (where required) before entries accepted.**

## **“MOONBUCCA” TROPHY – for the winning “Rich Fruit Cake”**

- ❖ The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants as printed in this schedule at all stages of the competition
- ❖ The NSW Rich Fruit Cake Competition is conducted to seek excellence in the preparation, cooking and presentation of a rich fruit cake and to promote Australian produce
- ❖ Cakes will be cut in half during judging
- ❖ Cakes should not exceed 57mm in height
- ❖ Winner at show level is eligible to enter the second (group) stage of the competition
- ❖ Competitors may participate in only one Group Final representing one Agricultural Show and, consequently, may represent only one Group in the subsequent State Final.
- ❖ The prize money for group level is \$50 and \$100 for state level
- ❖ Prize money and awards are sponsored by AgShows NSW
- ❖ The successful exhibitor will be required to bake a new cake at each stage of the competition
- ❖ Cakes should not be enclosed in plastic bags or any other material
- ❖ No decoration allowed

**The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants as printed in this schedule at all stages of the competition**

### **INGREDIENTS**

250g (8 oz) sultanas  
250 g (8 oz) chopped raisins  
250 g (8 oz) currants  
125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel  
90 g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries  
90 g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds  
1/3 cup sherry or brandy  
250 g (8 oz) plain flour  
60 g (2 oz) self-raising flour  
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger  
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves  
250g (8 oz) butter  
250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar  
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind  
1/2 teaspoon almond essence  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence  
4 large eggs

### **RECOMMENDED METHOD**

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices.

Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures.

Mix thoroughly.

The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

**Note:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

# AgShows NSW

## Wool Article / Garment State Competition

(Competition to be conducted at Society, Group & State level)

### Three different types of wool articles and/or garments

#### Conditions:

- ❖ For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
  - **Garment:** an article that can be worn e.g. a dress, jacket, scarf, hat, etc
  - **Article:** a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket; within an outfit e.g. bag; for amusement e.g. toy; as a decoration e.g. picture; etc
  - **Three Different Types:** the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in items of their construction technique and/or purpose e.g. 1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy *OR* e.g. 2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy *OR* e.g. 3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
- ❖ The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, 80% SHEEP wool.
- ❖ Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
- ❖ A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- ❖ An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
- ❖ All three articles/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- ❖ An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- ❖ An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- ❖ An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- ❖ If this class attracts no entries at the local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- ❖ It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the AgShows NSW Office in Sydney for the State judging.
- ❖ State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable)

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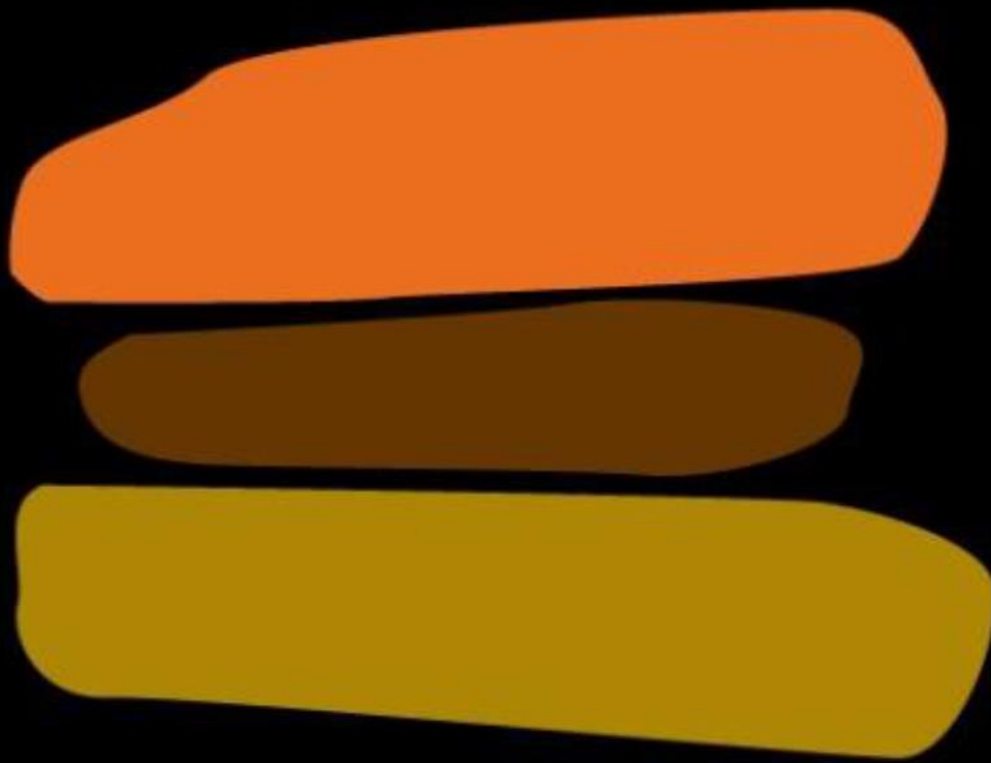

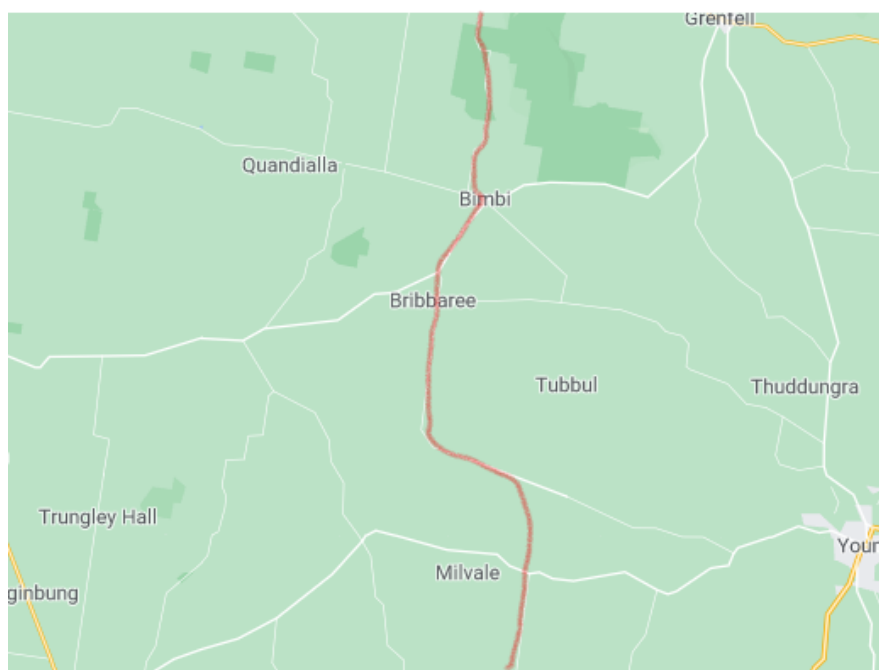
